- Entire policy for General Liability Insurance with the Grand Aerie named as Additionally Insured.
- Bond or Employee Dishonesty coverage
- Liquor Liability Insurance
- Signed 2017 Affiliation Agreement
- 990 filed for Fraternal Year ending on May 31
- Per Capita Tax, Membership Fees, Supplies Invoices and Dues Reminders Invoices paid in full to date
- Auditor & Treasurer Reports
- House Rules Submitted to the Grand Secretary's Office.

WE ARE STILL A PRIVATE CLUB!

One of the problems identified is the adherence to our standard '*three visit rule*'. It may be slightly different in your Aerie. It is a long-standing rule that non-members can visit an Aerie a total of three times a year, but then must become a member or cease coming to the Eagles. Eagles Aeries are a *Private Non-Profit Club* and therefore must be members only. (except the **three-visit** rule doesn't apply to those who rent space in our buildings.) It should be in everyone's by-laws.

The three-visit rule is designed to allow the person to see what the Eagles has to offer and to allow them to decide whether or not they would like to become an Eagle, Aerie or Auxiliary. We would hope they would like what they see and become a member!

To become a member is relatively easy... There should be applications near the front door for both Aerie and Auxiliary. You can get the one you want, fill it out and then take it to the bartender with either initiation or re-enrollment fee for new members or for re-enroll members. Then you will be contacted by the secretary about being interviewed and the initiation night. If you have a particular friend or family member to sponsor you that is great, or we will find you a sponsor. Spouses (if not a member) can only come into the Aerie when the member spouse is there and must leave when the spouse leaves.

If you were a member and let your membership lapse, then you are no longer allowed into the Aerie unless you re-enroll. You also **can not** be signed in as a guest. So, once a member, it would be best not to let your membership lapse.

These are rules that have always been in place, just not enforced by some management. I would hope everyone would understand this and not give the management a hard time, because they did not make up the rules, they are just trying to abide by them. You will hear a lot of complaining, but you'll get a lot of new and re-enroll members also.
